POSITION SUMMARY

The primary responsibility of the Staff Scientist (entry-level) is to provide technical support in toxicology and risk assessment in order to characterize adverse effects of chemicals and agents on human health and the environment. The Staff Scientist will perform routine human health and environmental risk assessments under supervision and more complex assignments as part of project teams. With experience, the Staff Scientist will be able to independently evaluate appropriate scientific methodology and apply that methodology to scientific questions. The position will also include some administrative, marketing, and general office support tasks, including engaging in activities that foster relationships with current and potential clients through communication and business development.

- Technical writing.
- Performs literature reviews of scientific literature and conducts toxicological research.
- Conducts data analysis including application of statistical/ computational methods.
- Conducts and documents QA/QC activities for work assignments.
